

PVC Marble Panel Usage and Cleaning Guide

We recommend that you carefully review this guide, which has been prepared to ensure that your PVC marble panels (available in High Gloss and Matte surface options), produced with superior quality and aesthetic standards, maintain their original elegance for many years.

1. General Maintenance and Cleaning Principles

Our PVC marble panels are manufactured to be resistant to moisture, water, and impacts; however, for long-lasting use, the following points must be observed during cleaning:

- **Regular Dust Removal:** Always remove dust and sand particles that may accumulate on the surface using a soft, dry cloth or microfiber mop before cleaning. This prevents surface scratching.
 - **Use of Soft Materials:** Never use steel wool, hard brushes, scouring pads, or abrasive sponges during cleaning. Only microfiber cloths or soft sponges should be used.
 - **Chemical Warnings:** Harsh chemicals may damage the surface texture of the panels. After cleaning, always rinse the surface and dry it with a clean cloth to prevent stains or residue.
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2. Cleaning Guide by Surface Type

Since High Gloss and Matte surfaces in our product range have different characteristics, the following details must be considered:

A. Cleaning High Gloss Surfaces

High Gloss surfaces, with their mirror-like finish, may show fingerprints and dust more easily than matte surfaces. To maintain their shine:

- **Recommended Solution:** Warm water with a few drops of mild pH-neutral dish detergent (or liquid soap).
- **Application:** Dip a microfiber cloth into the prepared solution and wring it thoroughly. Wipe the surface gently from top to bottom rather than using circular motions.
- **Gloss Protection:** Immediately after wiping, dry the surface with a clean, dry microfiber cloth to prevent water stains and residue that may dull the shine.

B. Cleaning Matte Surfaces

Textured matte surfaces provide a modern and simple appearance. To preserve their smooth texture:

- **Recommended Solution:** Warm water with a small amount of natural soap or a mild surface cleaner.
- **Application:** Lightly dampen the cloth and gently wipe the surface.
- **Stain Removal:** For stubborn stains (e.g., grease), avoid chemical solvents; instead, gently rub using soapy water.

3. Things Strictly to Avoid

To maintain warranty coverage and prevent deformation, the following must be strictly observed:

WARNING:

- **Never Use:** Hydrochloric acid, bleach, thinner, nitric acid, acetone, abrasive powders (such as Cif-type cream cleaners), and heavy solvent-based chemicals will permanently damage the panel surface.
- **Contact with Hot Objects:** Although panels are heat-resistant, avoid direct contact with high-temperature objects (such as irons or hot pots).
- **Sharp Tools:** Do not perform cutting or chopping operations directly on the surface.

4. Common Stains and Solutions

- **Fingerprints and Light Grease Stains:** Can be easily cleaned with a slightly damp microfiber cloth and an ammonia-free glass cleaner.
- **Tape, Labels, or Adhesive Residues:** Soften with warm water, then remove gently using a small amount of olive oil or a soapy cloth without scrubbing. Never use scraping tools.
